DRUG FREE SCHOOLS AND COMMUNITIES ACT (DFSCA)

As a requirement of the DFSCA, Mid-State Technical College is to disseminate and ensure receipt of the below policy/information to all students, staff, and faculty on an annual basis. Standards of Conduct

Mid-State is committed to providing an environment where learning and scholarship can flourish. The use of illegal drugs, and the illegal use of alcohol beverages is identified as conduct that adversely affects the college community. Mid-State Technical College regulations prohibit any unlawful possession, use, distribution, or sale of alcohol and other drugs by College students, faculty, staff, or guests on College owned property and at all College sponsored events.

Disciplinary Sanctions

The penalties for misconduct range from warning to expulsion. Students who violate the [Student Code of Conduct - https://www.mstc.edu/about-us/policies](https://www.mstc.edu/about-us/policies) will be referred to the Dean of Student Success. Students and staff are also subject to city ordinances and state and federal laws related to drugs and alcohol. Federal Drug Laws

The possession, use, or distribution of illicit drugs is prohibited by federal law. Strict penalties are enforced for drug convictions, including mandatory prison terms for many offenses. The following information, although not complete, is an overview of federal penalties for convictions. All penalties are doubled for any subsequent drug conviction.

- **Denial of Federal Aid (20 USC 1091):** Under the Higher Education Act of 1998, students convicted under federal or state law for the sale or possession of drugs will have their federal financial aid eligibility suspended. This includes all federal grants, loans, federal work study programs, and more. Students convicted of drug possession will be ineligible for one year from the date of the conviction of the first offense, two years for the second offense, and indefinitely for the third offense. Students convicted of selling drugs will be ineligible for two years from the date of the first conviction, and indefinitely for the second offense. Those who lose eligibility can regain eligibility by successfully completing an approved drug rehabilitation program.
- **Forfeiture of Personal Property and Real Estate (21 USC 853):** Any person convicted of a federal drug offense punishable by more than one year in prison shall forfeit to the United States any personal or real property related to the violation, including houses, cars, and other personal belongings. A warrant of seizure is issued and property is seized at the time an individual is arrested on charges that may result in forfeiture.
- **Federal Drug Trafficking Penalties (21 USC 841):** Penalties for federal drug trafficking convictions vary according to the quantity of the controlled substance involved in the transaction. The following list is a sample of the range and severity of federal penalties imposed for first convictions. Penalties for subsequent convictions are twice as severe. If death or serious bodily injury result from the use of a controlled substance which has been illegally distributed, the person convicted on federal charges of distributing the substance faces mandatory life sentence and fines ranging up to \$8 million. Persons convicted on federal charges of drug trafficking within 1,000 feet of a University (21 USC 845a) face penalties of prison terms and fines which are twice as high as the regular penalties for the offense, with a mandatory prison sentence of at least 1 year.

Of special note, 21 U.S.C. 860 provides that anyone convicted of distributing, possessing with intent to distribute, or manufacturing a controlled substance in or on, or within one thousand feet of, the real property comprising a public or private college, junior college, or university is subject to (1) twice the maximum punishment authorized by 21 U.S.C 841(b).

Students and employees face institution sanctions as well as federal, state, and local sanctions for violating.

- Possible effects include euphoria, drowsiness, respiratory depression, constricted pupils, nausea.
- Effects of overdose include slow and shallow breathing, clammy skin, convulsions, coma, possible death.
- Withdrawal syndromes include water eyes, runny nose, yawning, loss of appetite, irritability, tremors, panic, cramps, nausea, chills, sweating.

Impact of a Drug Conviction

If you are incarcerated in a federal or state institution you are not eligible for Federal Pell Grants or Federal Student Loans. If you are in an institution other than a federal or state you cannot get Federal Student Loans but you can be eligible for Federal Pell Grants. Your eligibility might also be suspended if the offense occurred while you were receiving federal student aid (grants, loans, or work-study.) If you aid has been suspended due to a drug conviction you can regain eligibility by completing an approved drug rehabilitation program or by passing two unannounced drug tests administered by an approved drug rehabilitation program. If you are convicted of a drug-related offense after you submit the FASFA form, you might lose eligibility for federal student aid, and you might be liable for returning any financial aid you received during a period of ineligibility.

Alcohol and Other Drugs (AOD) Resources

Counseling is available free of charge to all Mid-State students. While Mid-State does not treat drug or alcohol addiction, Mid-State Student Success Counselors are a great starting point to finding appropriate resources within the community.
