The Business Employees' Skills Training (BEST) program was established by the Wisconsin Legislature to help small businesses upgrade the skills of their workforce. Under the BEST program, The Department of Commerce can provide applicants with a tuition reimbursement grant to help cover a portion of the costs associated with training employees.

Eligible Applicants: Wisconsin for-profit businesses that have 25 or fewer full-time employees or annual sales of less than \$2.5 million and are in one of the following Industrial Clusters:

- Automation
- Agriculture/Food Products
- Biotechnology
- Information Technology
- Manufacturing
- Medical Devices
- Paper/Forest Products
- Printing
- Tourism
- Childcare *(does not include in-home childcare)*
