P.E.O. Program for Continuing Education**Deadline: No deadline given**

A maximum grant of \$2,000 is available to provide financial assistance to women who education has been interrupted and who find it necessary to resume studies due to changing demands in their lives. Applicants must have a need for financial assistance with their educational expenses to improve their marketable skills. The award is intended as a grant-in-aid for expenses such as tuition, books, transportation, or childcare necessary to reach the applicant's educational goal. Applicants must be sponsored by a P.E.O. chapter, have had 24 consecutive months as a non-student sometime in her adult life and is within 24 consecutive months of completing her education goal. Applications will be considered no more than four months prior to date of need on the application form. Minority Undergraduate Retention Grant**Deadline: Various**

Awards under this program are made to Wisconsin resident minority undergraduates, excluding first year students, enrolled at least half-time in independent, tribal, or Wisconsin Technical College institutions. According to the statutes, a minority student is defined as a student who is either an African American; American Indian; Hispanic; or Southeast Asian from Laos, Cambodia, or Vietnam admitted to the U. S. after December 31, 1975. Awards are based on financial need with a maximum grant of \$2,500 per year for up to eight semesters or twelve quarters.
