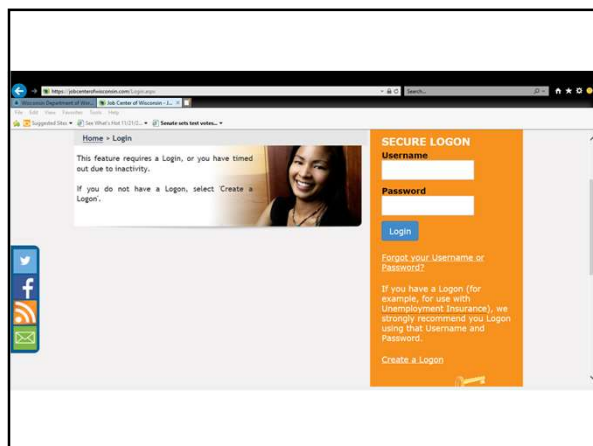

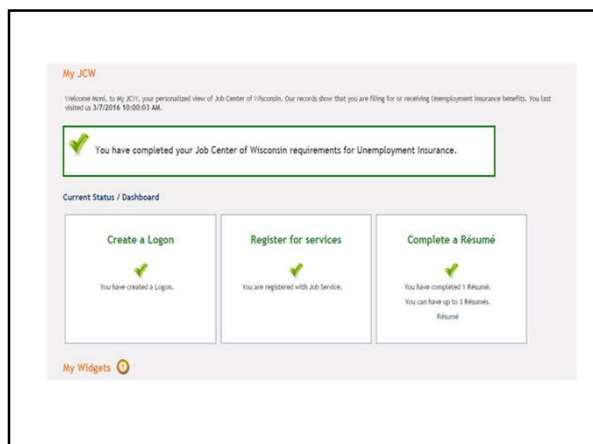

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

- Creating a “Prepared Workforce” through effective training and support services
- Creating a “Competitive Workforce” by meeting the demands of the labor market and economy

WIOA DISLOCATED WORKER SERVICES

Intensive Case Management

- Assignment of a Career Planner
- Eligibility Determination
- Required Assessments & Career Exploration
- Individualized Employment Planning
- Referrals to Appropriate Resources



CAREER SERVICES / JOB SEARCH

Individualized Assistance

- Resume Development and Review
- Job Search Skills and Coaching
- Interviewing Skills
- Direct Job Referrals and Connection to Employer Groups
- Out-of-Area Job Search
- Relocation Assistance



CAREER SERVICES / JOB SEARCH (cont.)

Out-of-area Job Search

- **Active Employment Search** for Full-time Work in Comparable Employment Outside of **40 Mile Radius** from Residence
- All Trips Must **Be Pre-approved by Career Planner**
- Assistance Provided with **Mileage** (\$.30/mile) and **Overnight Stay** (\$50.00/night)

Relocation Assistance

- Must Have **Job Offer** in Comparable Employment
- New Employment is Outside of **50 Mile Radius** from Residence
- Assistance Provided with **Associated Costs** (Maximum \$1,000)

TRAINING SERVICES

OJT – On-the-Job Training



- **Active Employment Search** for Full-time Work
- Must be Position that Requires **New Skills**
- **Career Planner** Develops Contract which Must be in Place **Prior** to Acceptance of Offer and/or Beginning New Position
- Assistance with **Associated Costs** can be Provided at 50% of Wage for up to 6 Month Training Period Based upon Contract and Budget

TRAINING SERVICES (cont.)

Occupational Classroom Training



- Follow Set Curriculum & Focus on Skills for **Specific Occupation** or Occupational Area
- **Credential** (Certificate/Diploma/Degree)
- Required **Assessments & Career Exploration**
- **Need for Training** and **Need for Self-Sufficiency**
- Select Training Directly Linked to **High-Demand** Occupations which produce **Self-Sufficiency**
- Select Training from **Eligible Training Program List (ETPL)**

TRAINING SERVICES (cont.)

Occupational Specific Training (cont.)

- Options Can be **Short-term, Long-term, Class-sized, Apprenticeship**
- **Full-time Training** Leading to Full-time Employment - Part-time Exceptions can Apply (Training Gaps, Special Circumstances)
- Required Coordination of **Financial Resources and Aid**
- Must Maintain **Satisfactory Progress** and Attendance
- **Tuition & Fees** (Based upon available funding up to maximum)
- **Supportive Services** During Training Based Upon Need and Availability of Funding (Books, Mileage and Childcare)

REGISTRATION AND ENROLLMENT PROCESS

Complete JCW Registration

Initial Meeting with Career Planner

- ✓ Discuss interests/needs and review WIOA eligibility and process

Eligibility Determination

- ✓ Completed WIOA application and required documents for verification

ESS – Economic Self-Sufficiency Calculation

- ✓ Required to determine whether eligible to receive training services

Enrollment into Assessment Services

- ✓ Required digital literacy skills assessment
- ✓ Required career exploration/interest assessment
- ✓ Required financial needs/budget assessment

IEP (Individual Employment Plan) Development

- ✓ **Point at which goals, activities and costs can be approved**

Trade Adjustment Assistance

- Additional Federal program that provides services if jobs are lost or threatened due to trade related circumstances such as:
 - Increased imports;
 - A shift in operations to certain countries; or
 - Supply or downstream production to certain companies with TAA-certified workers.
- Benefits may include employment and case management, training, job search and relocation allowances, TRA weekly allowances, RTAA wage subsidy (workers 50+) and HCTC (Health Care Tax Credit)

- TAA Intake – Workers will receive notice from DWD
- WIOA DW and TAA – Coordinated enrollments and services
