TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT between University of Wisconsin - Stout and Colleges of the Wisconsin Technical College System m B.S. Management

Developed in response to working professionals' need for additional education that supports career advancement as the Bachelor of Science degree in Management is a collaborative effo1t between the Colleges of the Wisconsin Technical College System, and the University of Wisconsin-Stout.

The 120-credit degree has a 40 credit General Education requirement, 45 credits of Major studies (27 credit Management Core+ 18 credit Concentration), and 35 credits in the Technical Emphasis area. The 35-credit block of courses in the Technical Emphasis area for the Management major requires the development of an area of expertise with credits culminated in the technical emphasis area. For purposes of transfer between the Colleges of the Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS colleges) and UW-Stout, a technical area is recognized as any of the areas for which the WTCS colleges offer either an A.AS. or two-year diploma program.

UW-Stout recognizes that the successful completion of the program at the WTCS colleges is sufficient evidence to warrant our acceptance of technical credits in this area towards the B.S. in Management. Students intending to utilize this agreement may choose to take courses concurrently at both the sending and receiving institutions.

General Education courses offered as a part of the A.A.S. program at the WTCS colleges in the areas of Communication Skills, Social Sciences, Math, and Science may also transfer and be used towards the B.S. Management. These applicable courses have been pre-determined and are available as to their transferability on Transferology. Those that have not been predetermined may be reviewed on a case-by-case basis after a review of course syllabi.

Based on the above infon11ation, students transferring from a WTCS college with an A.A.S. degree *that includes* transferable courses within the general education categories stated above, and a minimum of 35 technical emphasis and upon the application oftransferrable credits from their respective A.A.S. program core will need approximately 45-60 additional credits to complete the B.S. Management at UW-Stout. A student from a qualified A.A.S. degree program will typically transfer 16-20 credits of general education and 35 credits of Technical Emphasis (*this iriformalion may vwy dependent upon the A.A.S. degree earned*) and concentration.

Students intending to utilize this alticulation agreement are encouraged to reach out to the Transfer Coordinator or Associate Director of Admissions (UW-Stout contact person on this agreement) early in their degree at one of the WCTS institutions to determine estimated transferability of credits based on their A.A.S. degree.

The foltowing disclaimers/limitations apply for the B.S. Management:

- 1. Each student must satisfy the University racial and ethnic studies and global perspectives requirements for graduation.
- 2. Remaining general education requirements may be fulfiJled through any regionally accredited post-secondary institution. It is the student's responsibility to have official transcripts showing completion of these courses, including grades, forwarded to the UW-Stout to be added to their academic record and counted towards the B.S. degree.
- 3. Student credit will be reviewed on a case-by-<:ase basis including credit for prior learning. This revievv may result in students utilizing transfer credits in a more comprehensive manner and not need to complete the full 45-60 credits noted above.
- 4. Students at UW-Stout wiJI be required to complete a minimum of 32 credits in residence for a bachelor's degree at UW-Stout. By completing the Professional and technical studies portion of this degree, most students will satisfy the 32-credit residency requirement.
- 5. The program plan included with this agreement reflects the requirements in the Management program which pertains to this agreement. The plan sheet can also be viewed at https://www.mvstout.edu/programs/bs-management
- 6. This articulation agreement applies only to the B.S. Management degree in effect 2023 fall semester, until revised. A change of major invalidates these course/credits for transfer unless they are approved ,vithin some other program-to-program articulation agreement for another major at UW-Stout.
