# What Is the Difference Between AP and Dual Credit?

Dual Credit courses allow for high school students to earn college credit while still in high school. Under this program, students take courses that are offered by Mid-State and receive both high school and college credit at the same time. Dual Credit courses are free.

AP courses are also taken in high school. They are college-level courses designed and administered by the College Board, and culminate in an AP Exam. Students must score well on the AP exam to receive college credit. The cost of an AP exam is \$98.
