Each municipality's share is proportioned by the equalized values that are certified by the Department of Revenue (DOR). Details regarding Mid-State's levy, change in property valuation and resulting mill rates, along with valuation changes by property classification, distribution by county, and value changes in Tax

Incremental Districts, and a District Board Resolution certifying the 2025-2026 property tax levy will be reviewed. Administration is proposing the Boards certification of a \$14,488.049 levy. Mid-State's valuation for tax purposes totals \$23.4 billion reflecting a 9.7% increase, whereas Mid-State's tax rate based on equalized value will be \$0.61893 cents per \$1,000. A home valued at \$100,000 will have a tax bill of \$61.89; this decrease from prior year results in \$5.64 of property tax savings. Certification of Mid-State's \$14,488,049 property tax levy for FY26 will be requested.

2025-26 Tax Levy Certification Resolution

BE IT RESOLVED that the Mid-State Technical College Board authorized a \$14,488,049 property tax levy for fiscal year 2026, representing an overall mill rate of \$0.61893 on \$23,408,213,197 of equalized valuation without TIFs within the boundaries of the Mid-State Technical College District.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this levy be made up of \$7,323,325 in operational levy representing an operational mill rate of \$0.31285 and \$7,167,724 in debt service representing a debt service mill rate of \$0.30608.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that administration apportion this levy based on the certified equalized property values for its 97 municipalities and notify them of their apportionment in accordance with state statutes.



Financial Report

I. Executive Summary

Purpose: Provide an overview of financial performance for the three months ending September 2025.

Key Highlights:

- Year-to-date revenues reached \$10.9 million (18.9%) of the annual budget.
- Year-to-date expenditures totaled \$15.4 million (23.0%) of budget.
- Fund equity remains strong at \$27.1 million, reflecting the timing of property tax and debt-related revenues.
- Student Fees are at 57.6% of budget due to semester billings.
- Federal revenues at 22.5% of budget reflect timing of drawdowns.
- Capital Outlay shows a temporary negative due to timing of reimbursements.
- Early-year activity aligns with expected seasonal patterns; no significant anomalies noted.


Context:


- September represents the first quarter of the fiscal year. Percentages remain below the long-term average but consistent with timing expectations.
- Local property tax receipts and interfund transfers are anticipated in later months.

II. Revenue Analysis

- Total Revenues: \$10.9 million (18.9% of budget)
- Local Government: No collections to date; expected later in fiscal year.
- Student Fees: \$4.7 million, representing 57.6% of budget—driven by semester billing cycles.
- State Aid & Grants: \$2.4 million (12.7% of budget), consistent with early-year recognition schedules.
- Institutional Revenue: \$1.45 million (26.4% of budget), reflecting internal sales, insurance recoveries, and other service income.
- Federal Revenue: \$2.35 million (22.5% of budget) tied to timing of federal aid disbursements.

Revenue collection patterns are typical for this point in the fiscal year, with higher student fee activity offset by delayed property tax and aid receipts.










III. Expenditure Analysis


- Total Expenditures: \$15.4 million (23.0% of budget)
- Salaries and Wages: \$5.3 million (23.6%), tracking as expected.
- Benefits: \$2.0 million (23.7%), consistent with wage expenditures.
- Current Expenditures: \$2.4 million (25.7%), slightly front-loaded from early supply and contracted service costs.
- Student Financial Aid & Activities: \$3.6 million (44.8%), reflecting the timing of financial aid disbursements.
- Resale: \$553,891 (46.6%) consistent with bookstore and food service timing.
- Capital Outlay: Temporary negative balance (-2.0%) due to pending reimbursements.
- Debt Retirement: \$1.7 million (19.3%), aligned with scheduled early-year debt payments.

Spending trends are consistent with expectations. Most categories are near or below the 25% proportional benchmark for the first quarter.









IV. Fund Equity Summary

- Accrued YTD Fund Equity: \$27.1 million as of September 2025.
- Change in Fund Equity: Year-to-date deficit of \$4.48 million due to timing of revenue recognition versus expenditures.
- Proceeds from Debt: \$6.0 million received; additional \$1.5 million anticipated later in the fiscal year.
- Variances by Fund:
- Capital Projects and Debt Service show lower equity due to timing of outlays and delayed reimbursements.
- Operating and self-funded insurance funds maintain stable reserves.

Fund equity remains healthy, supported by planned debt proceeds and expected property tax inflows later in the year.

V. Combined Balance Sheet Summary

- Assets: Reflect strong cash and investments balances across all funds.
- Receivables: Consistent with early billing and collection cycles.
- Liabilities: Primarily scheduled debt payments, accrued payroll, and interfund payables.
- Fund Equity: Remains stable and sufficient for operational and capital needs, with notable reserves including:
- \$3.5 million for capital projects
- \$2.4 million for self-insurance
- \$6.6 million for post-employment benefits.

The College maintains a sound financial position with adequate liquidity, balanced fund equity, and no significant variances from projected early-year trends.
